





Who should get the flu vaccine?

The flu vaccine (influenza vaccination) is recommended for people 6 months or older. All eligible people especially those with underlying conditions and those at higher risk should get a flu vaccine.

What are the symptoms of the flu?

- Fever or feeling feverish.
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- Muscle or body aches.

Chills.

Headaches.

Cough.

Fatigue (tiredness).

Sore throat.

- Vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children
- Runny or stuffy nose.

Why should I get the flu vaccine?

Getting your annual flu vaccine can stop you from getting symptoms of the flu.

It is especially important this year as the symptoms of the flu are **very similar to the symptoms of COVID-19**. Getting the flu vaccine can prevent you from becoming ill with the flu and **reduce the risk of confusion** with COVID-19.

Without the flu vaccine and with the added risk of COVID-19, your chances of severe illness and even death **increase significantly**.

If you get the flu shot, there is a small chance you might still get the flu. However, if you do, the illness is usually **mild and lasts for a shortened period of time**.

When should I get a flu vaccine?

You should get your flu vaccine before the flu virus begins spreading in your community. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that people get a flu vaccine by the end of October. However, even if you cannot get your flu vaccine early, you should still get it anytime during flu season, which lasts until April.

- If you have questions about getting the COVID-19 vaccine and the flu vaccine at the same time.
