New York State Withholds 20% Funding

On August 21, 2020, the Office for People With Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) issued a memo to OPWDD Providers. It stated effective immediately it will withhold 20% of all non-Medicaid Local Assistance payments made with 100% State funds to address the unprecedented financial effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on New York State.

In the event Federal stimulus funding is not provided to New York State, Providers were directed to develop a plan with the OPWDD Regional District Offices to allocate these withholds on a recurring basis. A Virtual Town Hall on Cuts: September 9 @ 7pm

Day Services Required to Post Safety Plans

The Office for People With Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) revised the July 15, 2020 Interim Guidance regarding the reopening of day services to include the following requirements:

 Each day service program must consider the specific needs and circumstances of the individuals they serve to ensure individuals they are able to participate to the largest extent possible.

- 2. To help the appropriate parties (individuals, families, other caregivers, and Care Managers) in the decision-making process, OPWDD day services must provide access to their safety plans, so they can be reviewed proactively and remotely.
- By the close of business on September 4, 2020, day service providers must post their safety plans to their websites. If plans are not yet developed, they will be posted to websites when they've been submitted and attested by OPWDD.


