COVID-19 Updated Staffing/Return to Work Guidance

On 11.10.20, OPWDD issued two updated guidance documents for providers regarding staffing and return to work which reflects the most current <u>travel</u> <u>advisory guidance</u> issued by the NYS Department of Health:

- Health Advisory: Revised Protocols for Personnel in Clinical and Direct Care Settings to Return to Work Following COVID-19 Exposure or Infection.
- Revised Staff Guidance for the Management of Coronavirus (COVID-19)
 in Facilities or Programs Operated and/or Certified by the Office for
 People With Developmental Disabilities

OPWDD Front Door Update Requirements

OPWDD Health Advisory and Guidance

On 10.23.20, OPWDD issued <u>interim guidance on designated cluster mitigation</u> and <u>oversight</u> to limit the spread of COVID-19. This guidance is applicable to programs and facilities certified or operated by OPWDD located within the geographic zones designated as part of New York State Governor's strategic response to micro-clusters via the <u>Cluster Action Initiative</u>.

The Office for People With Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) announced an opportunity for the public to comment on the draft OPWDD Comprehensive Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Waiver Amendment. This HCBS Waiver is the Medicaid program that provides opportunities for adults

and children with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (I/DD) to receive services in their own home or community.
